ISHP has been actively engaged with our lawmakers during the 2023 Legislative Session.

In mid-January, ISHP, along with the Idaho State Pharmacy Association and the ISU College of Pharmacy, collaborated on Pharmacy Day at the Capitol to promote pharmacy practice and support legislative efforts that could impact your practice for years to come. ISHP spent time educating legislators on how health-system pharmacists contribute to the healthcare industry in Idaho. ISU Pharmacy students



were also on hand to present their research posters to legislators. The day concluded with a Legislative Reception at Beside Bardenay, which provided an opportunity for our members to talk with legislators and explain the challenges and opportunities in the pharmacy industry.

As we begin Week 8 of the 2023 Legislative Session, ISHP is watching legislation concerning Certified Medication Assistants, public health measures related to COVID-19, vitamins and supplements, vaping devices, Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs), Medicaid expansion, and Medicaid managed care, among other things.
